If you have a 'statement', then you should provide a full sentence, being careful to ensure that the preposition is not accidentally taken as part of the question. Your original question stem from another question, that is, a question of fact versus a question of opinion. Look at your last line: it = it + 'it', what does that equal in the test? This could be read in two possible ways: you have a fact question: What does it = it + 'it' equal in the test? You have an opinion question: what does it = it + 'it' equal in the test
